Yonac Software releases Thereminator version 1.1

Update of popular Apple iPhone musical instrument explores new innovations and processing power the iPhone has to offer.

(New York, NY – September 15, 2008) Yonac Software today released the first official update for the Thereminator, an iPhone application. Thereminator is a program based on the theremin, a unique musical instrument known for its role in 50s sci-fi film soundtracks and being the only instrument played by physical gesture. Thereminator is a new type of musical instrument that encourages artists and musicians to create wherever they go.

This updated version of Thereminator includes many improvements suggested by the program's users. "I think Thereminator and musical iPhone enthusiasts will be delighted to experience the smoother sounds on this latest update," says head programmer James Yonac. "Feedback from users played a key part in the new features." Pops and cracks that occurred during rapid volume changes have been eliminated. Version 1.1 also features an improved response for the frequency slider and reduced initial latency.

Another new addition is a new reverb module. The Thereminator player can now choose among short, medium, and long delay times. An auto attack/release filter is another exciting edition to the instrument. Thereminator 1.1 is now available via the Apple iTunes app store for iPhone and iPod touch for a price of \$2.99.

Yonac Software was founded in New York City in 2008. The company mainly focuses on the development of music and sound related software. Yonac's first application for the iPhone was TuneORama, a guitar tuner released in early September 2008.
